#### Habitat 67

Designed by Moshe Safdie

for Expo 67, the Montreal 1967 Universal Exhibition. This residential complex is an experiment in modular design. The idea for this Habitat is that it would be a way for

the middle class to improve its quality of life in an urban environment. The original design of 354 identical prefabricated boxes resulted in 158 apartments (now reduced to 146). There are 90 -minute tours offered daily that cover the history and allow the viewing of an unoccupied unit. Check out this amazing architectural curiosity while on your way to the Biosphere.

#### **Notre Dame Basilica**

Designed in Gothic Revival stylings in 1824 by New Yorker James O'Donnell, the Notre Dame Basilica was built as the largest church in North America (a title it held for 50 years). The Basilica boasts a Casa-



vant Frères pipe organ - 92 electropneumatic action stops, 4 keyboards, and a sound-bending 7,000 individual pipes. Guided tours are given every 20 minutes each day in both English and French.

## NPSA PROFILE— JOHN O'RORKE

I first started attending NPSA conferences in 1994, shortly after I arrived at Frostburg State University. I was introduced to NPSA by a colleague, Joan Andorfer, the now Secretary and Executive Board member of NPSA, as a vehicle for presenting my research on teaching and learning. I received such a warm welcome and such wonderful feedback and support (teaching and learning at that time was an infant field in Political Science and hardly present at the conferences), that I continued to attend and present. In 1998, I was appointed Chair of the Teaching and Learning section and served in that position until 2010 when I became NPSA Treasurer.

I continue to return to the conference and serve the organization because of the many wonderful people I've met through NPSA. I have many fond memories of the conferences over the years including panels I attended and the presentations I gave, but I most fondly remember the social interactions with people attending the conferences. These include: going out to dinner with then President Francine D'Amico in Boston in 2009, where she talked me into becoming Treasurer (the wine did flow that night); and sitting with Koop Berry, current Director of Member Engagement, in a pub in Philadelphia discussing the future of NPSA over burgers and beers; countless adventures with Jeff Kraus, Executive

Director, as we try to cope with the myriad little issues that always seem to creep up on us (despite all our best efforts); and our annual Friday night dinner repasts with Don Fusting of Lanahan Publishers – all of whom I met through NPSA and count as dear friends.

I graduated from Williams College in 1982, majoring in Political Science; received my Masters in Public Administration from SUNY@ Albany in 1984; and my Ph.D. in Comparative Politics from The University of Pennsylvania in 1997. I am currently a Professor of Political Science at Frostburg State University, in Frostburg, MD.




### NEWS FROM THE COMMUNITY

Member **Alex Priou** has had his book, **Becoming Socrates: Political Philosophy in Plato's "Parmenides"**, recently published.

In this commentary on the *Parmenides*, Alex Priou argues that the dialogue is, in actuality, a reflection on politics. Priou begins from the accepted view that the conversation consists of two discrete parts -- a critique of the forms, followed by Socrates' philosophical training -- but finds a unity to the dialogue yet to be acknowledged. By paying careful attention to what Parmenides

calls the "greatest impasse" facing Socrates' ontology, Priou reveals a political context to the conversation. The need in society for order and good rule includes the need, at a more fundamental level, for an adequate and efficacious explanation of being. Recounting here how a young Socrates first learned of the primacy of political philosophy, which would become the hallmark of his life, Becoming Socrates shows that political philosophy, and not ontology, is "first philosophy."
