As we gear up for the 51st NPSA conference, we are excited by the number of paper and panel submissions. If you submitted a paper or panel proposal you should have received your acceptance/non-acceptance by now. The panels are formed by mid-August and then the scheduling starts. By **September 1**, when the registration site opens, the schedule will be up on the NPSA site (www.northeasternpsa.com). Your scheduling information will also be available to you via the All Academic submission site.

One of the new features of our All Academic site is that anyone who submitted a proposal and had it accepted, as well as anyone who volunteered to participate as a chair or discussant will receive an email asking you to confirm your participation. You will have to either accept or decline the opportunity to participate in each role. It is very important that you verify your acceptance in order to participate in November's conference.

GUIDED WALKING TOUR OF PHILADELPHIA

CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR 2018 NPSA PAPER AWARD WINNERS

Pi Sigma Alpha/NPSA Best Paper Award

Isadora Borges Monroy (McGill University), "The European Voter Privacy-Security Choice during 2014 EU Elections." Isadora Borges Monroy is a PhD candidate at the Department of Political Science at McGill University, Canada. She studies attitudes on digital privacy, tools and reactions to mass surveillance, hacker communities, pirate parties, and government policy to regulate the internet. Her MA thesis is entitled *An Architecture of Control: Automatic Takedown Notices in Academic Digital Publishing* (University of Chicago) explored the growth of private policing of online copyright. Her current PhD research project examines the political consequences of mass online surveillance in advanced democracies.

McWilliams Best Faculty Paper in Theory

Guillaume Bogiaris (University of West Alabama), "Machiavelli's Literary Works as a Critique of the Platonic Eros." Dr. Guillaume Bogiaris is assistant professor of political science at the University of West Alabama. His interests include all things Machiavelli, receptions of Platonism, and the gender and ethnic politics of Quebec. He is currently working on a monograph based on his dissertation, tentatively titled *Machiavelli's Platonic Problems*, of which his award-winning paper is a part.

McWilliams Best Graduate Student Paper in Theory

Yingqi (Ariel) Tang (Yale University), "The Apprenticeship of Freedom": Time, Reason, and Authority in Rousseau's and Tocqueville's Education."

Yingqi (Ariel) Tang is a PhD student in political science at Yale University. Her academic interests broadly cover topics in the history of political thought, comparative political theory, and education as a theme in intellectual history. Her current research examines the role of authority in education, with focus on the idea of apprenticeship in eighteenth and nineteenth century German and French political thought. Yingqi earned a BA in philosophy and political science from Barnard College in 2016.

Best NPSA Paper on Identity Politics

Mary Ryan (Virginia Tech), "Harvesting US Democracy: The Kerner Commission on Police Brutality, White Supremacy, and Race."

Mary K. Ryan received her Ph.D. in Social, Political, Ethical, and Cultural Thought from Virginia Tech in May 2019. Her dissertation was titled The Democratic Kaleidoscope in the United States: Vanquishing Structural Racism in the U.S. Federal Government. Mary has published many pieces on race, democracy, and social justice, including book chapters in *Critical Insights: Civil Rights Literature Past and Present* (Salem); Surveillance, Race, Culture (Palgrave Macmillan); Spaces of Surveillance: States and Selves (Palgrave Macmillan); and forthcoming in The Representation of Poverty in Popular Culture (McFarland) as well as peerreviewed journal articles in Theoria: A Journal of Social and Political Theory and the Journal for the Study of Peace and Conflict.

Best NPSA Paper on Gender Issues

John D'Attoma (University of Exeter), "Gender, Social Value Orientation, and Tax Compliance."

John is an assistant professor in International Politics and Business at the University of Exeter Business School and within the Tax Administration Research Centre. His research lies in the field of comparative political economy and investigates how political institutions, norms, and social preferences shape behavior and why seemingly similar democratic countries have such different policy outcomes. His research has focused on taxation and tax behavior in Europe and America, and most recently, he is studying the relationship between inequality in financial secrecy. Verena Benoit (University of Bamberg, Germany), "Conservative Values Challenge Religious People's Acceptance of Muslim Immigrants."

Verena Benoit, M.A. is a doctoral fellow at the University of Bamberg and the Bamberg Graduate School of Social Sciences in Bamberg, Germany. She holds a bachelor's and a master's degree in Sociology from the University of Bamberg. Her research focuses on the link between religion, denomination, and attitudes toward immigrants, especially Muslim immigrants, in Europe. She got awarded a doctoral scholarship from the Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung E.V. and her work includes, among others, a report in collaboration with the Bertelsmann-Stiftung. She is a guest lecturer at the HfK+G in Ulm and was a visiting researcher at Princeton University, NJ.

NPSA Profile- Azzedine Layachi

Azzedine Layachi is professor of politics at St. John's University in New York City where he teaches on a variety of topics, including the Middle East and North Africa, Africa, International Law, Nationalism and Ethnic Politics, Migration Politics, and US Foreign Policy.

In recent years, Azzedine has served as associate director of the Center for Global Studies, member of the Executive Board of the American Institute of North African Studies (AIMS), and Associate Editor of the Bulletin of the Middle East Studies Association (MESA). He currently serves on the Advisory Boards of the Maghreb Center (USA)

and is a consultant to private and Vice-President, after public institutions.

Dr. Layachi received a PhD and MA in politics from New York University and a BA from the Institut des Études Politiques of the University of Algiers, Algeria. He is the author of numerous books, chapters, and journal articles on North Africa and the Middle East, including Economic Crisis and Political Change in North Africa; State, Societv and Liberalization in Morocco; The United States and North Africa: A Cognitive Approach to Foreign Policy; and Global Studies: The Middle East. He is currently finishing a book on Algeria: History, People and Political Struggle.

Azzedine began serving on the NPSA board in 2003 as Second

having been in the previous years the program chair and president of the New York State Political Science Association. He then served as NPSA's Program Chair for the 2004 Boston Conference and then president of NPSA in 2004-2005. Since 2003, he has also been the NPSA Webmaster, managing the website of the association. Along with serving in these functions, he regularly acts as chair, discussant, and paper presenter on panels dealing with various topics in the field.
