The Northeastern Political Science Association's 2019 Meeting in Philadelphia, PA

The Northeastern Political Science Association's 51st Annual Conference was held in Philadelphia on November 7-9th at the Wyndham in the Historical District. The meeting bought together more than 450 scholars representing a broad array of topics and subfields in political science. Researchers of all categories (faculty and graduate and undergraduate) were able to share and receive feedback on scholarship at the cutting-edge of the field. In addition to taking part in 107 panels and roundtables, participants came together for a keynote address by Dr. Paula D. McClain, president of the American Political Science Association (APSA) and a Pi Sigma Alpha Lecture delivered by Julia Terruso, a political reporter for the Philadelphia Inquirer. Also, our Executive Director, Jeff Kraus, was recognized for his 30 years of service to NPSA (story inside). Awards were given for a variety of "best of " papers from last years' conference. In between panels, luncheons, and receptions, our guests enjoyed the sites of the beautiful historic district of Philadelphia, including nearby Independence Hall, the National Constitution Center, and the Museum of the American Revolution, and a group Constitution Walk — all of which make Philadelphia the perfect setting for the contemplation of the state of current political events and disciplinary studies.

The conference was a success thanks to the hard work of our many section chairs who helped to curate the program and the many volunteers who served as panel chairs and discussants. As always, we are grateful to all of our participants and volunteers who lend their time and professionalism to making the NPSA conference a welcoming and worthwhile event. We thank all who attended and hope to see all of you in Boston, Massachusetts in 2020.

NPSA Profile— Eric Budd

Eric Budd is not a stranger to NPSA. He is a professor of Political Science at Fitchburg State University, where he has taught since 1994. He received his doctorate in Political Science from the University of Chicago in 1993, his Masters from Chicago in 1989, and a BA in Politics from Brandeis University in 1985. Eric is the former Chair of the Economics, History and Political Science Department.

He is the author of Democratization, Development, and the Patrimonial State in the Age of Globalization and Conflicted are the Peacemakers: Israeli and Palestinian Moderates and the Death of Oslo. His current research is on how historical memories can prevent reconciliation in post-conflict societies.

Eric started with NPSA in 1996 as a presenter. He soon began volunteering as chair and discussant on panels in the Comparative and International Sections. He was Section Chair for Comparative Politics Section from 2001 – 2009. He served as Program Chair for the NPSA's conference in 2010, and then the President of the NPSA 2010-2011. Eric served as Second Vice Chair last year and will now prepare our 52nd Conference.

It will be at the historic Omni Parker House Hotel Submissions for papers, panels, and roundtables will be accepted beginning in March 1. The deadline for submitting a proposal is June 15, 2020.

As always, we need volunteers to serve as panel chairs and discussants and we encourage graduate and undergraduate students to submit proposals. Please volunteer using the All Academic site where you will create your account to submit a paper proposal and volunteer.

However, a paper presenter may also serve as a chair or discussant on another panel or as a roundtable participant; faculty members may serve in the additional role of mentor for undergraduate research.
